We believe that there is a special feel at Hounslow Town, which is as much to do with our welcoming, friendly and caring atmosphere, as our appreciation and use of the UN Rights of the Child and our Hounslow Town values. These are at the core of everything we do.

Hounslow Town Primary School is committed to serving its local, national and international community. We recognise the multi-cultural and multi-faith nature of the United Kingdom and welcome families from all walks of life into our school which creates a rich, diverse community. We understand the crucial role our school plays in promoting British Values, which in school we refer to as Shared Values.

Our 'Hounslow Town child' and 'Hounslow Town adult' values underpin our teaching and learning, and provide an environment which prepares our pupils as confident, happy citizens of the United Kingdom.

Democracy

- ◆ Children are involved in Democratic process e.g. voting for school councillors, Anti Bullying VIPs, focus for enrichment days etc.
- ◆ The school council is led by a member of staff who adhere to democratic processes.
- ◆ We have links with the local PCSOs who come into school to educate the children about upholding British Law and prosecution service.

The Rule of Law

- ◆ We have links with the local police, as mentioned under the Democracy section.
- ◆ We have a clearly structures behaviour policy which all stakeholders understand and follow.
- ◆ We regularly review behaviour incidents in school and share these with key stakeholders.
- ◆ Assemblies are delivered with a focus on the law e.g. Safety Awareness and E-safety.

Individual Liberty

- ◆ The aims, ethos and values of the school are embodied in all that we do in school.
- ◆ Through our curricular clubs and opportunities, children are given the freedom to make choices.
- ◆ Children have key roles and responsibilities in school, particularly in Key Stage 2, these include but do not limit: lunch time play leaders, ICT Digital Leaders, Maths Ambassadors, Reception Support Workers, Assembly monitors



Tolerance of those of Different Faiths & Beliefs

- ◆ Our R.E Curriculum provide a broad and balanced education on a range of faiths, religions and cultures.
- ◆ Our school is 89% EAL which we believe adds further enrichment to our community. We focus on promoting learning for all children regardless of their starting points, supporting them with integration into our school society.

Mutual Respect

- ◆ Our PSHCE curriculum embodies values of mutual respect through units of learning such as 'Be Friendly, Be Wise' and 'Learn to Respect'.
- ◆ Respect is embedded within our whole school ethos as a Rights Respecting School.
