I am very proud of the outcome and it is a reflection of the commitment and dedication of the staff, children and families. The success of the school is dependent on good relationships and partnerships between the whole school community. I will pass on congratulations to staff.

We will consider the relevant actions to address the next steps highlighted by OFSTED, but I would like to highlight attendance and persistent absence. This is something that only families can work on to improve – we will encourage, monitor and try to support as much as we can, but if you are taking children out of school during term time it negatively affects their achievements in school. We all understand there can be reasons to want children out during term time, but many families manage personal situations differently to ensure that their children miss as little school as possible. I hope that we can work together to address this matter.
